KNOW YOUR POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Lucerne Lakes South Pool is available for all members and their guests to use. However, be aware and mindful of the rules and regulations that go along with using the pool. These rules are posted on the fence inside the pool area. Please read the rules prior to taking your dip. Please remember, also, after using the umbrellas, chairs, ash trays, inflatable toys, etc., all items should be replaced in their original places. We do not employ a regular pool attendant so it's up to all of us to "police" the area. If everyone does their part, our pool will remain an amazing amenity to our community.

The pool hours are daylight hours (dawn to dusk), but not before 7:00 a.m. The pool has not been permitted for night-time swimming, yet. Stay tuned for a possible change to swimming hours as we upgrade the lighting in and around the pool. The club-



house is open from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. If you enter either the pool or the clubhouse prior to 7:00 a.m., an alarm will sound, our security firm will be notified, and the police will possibly be dispatched.

SAFE BIKEWAYS/PATHWAYS

A six-foot path was established when our community was first developed. This path provides a safe place for pedestrians to walk and bike off the vehicular roadway. When the pathway is



blocked by a parked vehicle, it forces people to walk or use wheelchairs/scooters on the roadway. Pedestrian safety is at risk and this situation also creates a legal liability for the homeowner and the HOA.


Homeowners and renters are reminded not to block any portion of the walkway at any time. Homeowners and renters should also remind their guests and service people not to block the pathway at any time. Please suggest to your visitors/service providers to park on the roadway. Parking on the roadway is permitted between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. Your visitors may also park, overnight, in the overflow parking lot adjacent to the clubhouse. Be sure to place the resident's name, address, and phone number on a paper in the front windshield of the vehicle.

ARE YOU PREPARED FOR A HURRICANE?

While we never WANT a hurricane, it's best to be prepared for one.

Below are some ideas of ways to get ready for whatever may come our way:

- Make a family plan. Who does what and where will your family ride out the storm.
- Locate your water meter and electrical shutoff valves/switches.
- Know the disaster plan of your loved ones; those in school and who work.
- Trim trees and store loose objects, like flags, garbage cans, patio chairs, etc.
- Install and test your smoke detector.
- Use a camera for video or take pictures of the contents of your home. Store these video/photos in a safe place or with a friend who lives out of town.
- Photocopy important papers and store safely. One of the most waterproof areas in your home is the dishwasher.
 You may consider placing your will, house deed, and other important papers in the dishwasher.
- Make plans to board pets especially if you plan to ride out the storm in a shelter. Most shelters do not have accommodations for pets.
- Obtain some extra cash or travelers checks.
- Establish an out-of-state contact to call in case of emergency.

CURBSIDE GARBAGE, YARD WASTE AND BULK COLLECTION WILL CHANGE ON OCTOBER 1, 2019

The Palm Beach County Solid Waste Authority's explains the changes as follows:

**GARBAGE- Every residential curbside customer will receive a new garbage cart that will be delivered to your home, most likely in the months of August and September. Please DO NOT use the cart until October 1st when the new service starts. On October 1st, all garbage must be placed inside the new cart. You will be able to purchase a second cart, if you need one, for a one-time fee of \$65. There will be no additional collection or disposal charges for the additional cart. Your hauler will be responsible for the repair/replacement of the cart. Garbage will still be collected twice a week.

**BULK SERVICE – Bulk collection like appliances, furniture, and large household items that do not fit

in your cart will be provided one day per week and limited to no more than three items. If you have more than the allowed three items, contact SWA Customer Service at 561-697-2700 for an estimate to have the additional items removed.

**YARD WASTE – If your yard waste pile exceeds 6 cubic yards, the yard waste will not be picked up. The pile will be tagged and will be the responsibility of the resident to arrange for pickup for an extra fee. Debris other than palm fronds and tree branches, such as leaves, tree and hedge trimmings, pine needles, etc., must be containerized. The tree branches and palm fronds should be neatly stacked in a pile that does not exceed 6 cubic yards. Branches should be cut into pieces that are no more than 6 feet long, 6 inches in diameter, and weigh no more than 50 pounds each. Palm fronds can be any length.
