### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Covid-19 is still with us. Please stay safe. Most activities within the HOA are on hold but we did have several items to report from our July Board meeting which was held at the Forest Hills Golf Course patio, including:

- Cesar Romagosa resigned as a HOA Board Member.
- Jayne Subwick was appointed to replace Jean Pasqua on the Board.
- Jean Pasqua's many responsibilities were distributed between the existing Board members. See "Community Contacts on the following page for more information.
- Two items on the Reserve Fund were approved including hurricane shutters to be installed at the Clubhouse and replacement of up to ten security cameras in the Clubhouse.
- After a healthy discussion, it was decided to start the process of reopening the pool and deck with limited hours and other restrictions.

The Board usually does not meet in July and August but because we missed March, April, and May due to virus concerns, it was decided to meet in July and August.

The next Board meeting will be August 19, 2020 at 6:30 p.m. and will most likely take place at the Golf Course patio, again. As the date nears, check the meeting announcement posted on the Clubhouse door for further information regarding the location of the meeting. We are required to use social distancing and face masks at our meeting (as required by Palm Beach County regulations).

### **COMMUNITY POOL TO REOPEN**

After many discussions and consultations, the HOA Board has decided to reopen the pool and deck with restrictions as they apply to Covid-19 virus. Hours of operation will be limited. It is important that we keep our facilities and residents safe during this pandemic. Those who decide to use the facility must help in this effort. The rules and times are subject to change as warranted. See the restrictions in the next column.

### **LLHOA POOL REOPENING**

All residents must abide by CDC, Florida State and Palm Beach County guidelines for community pool use during the Palm Beach County Emergency Declaration. Lucerne Lakes HOA users bear the responsibility of such compliance and assume the full risk of utilizing the community pool.

- If you or a member of your household has flulike symptoms, **DO NOT ENTER THE POOL**.
- Residents only. No guests at any time.
- Social distancing required at all times on the deck and in the pool. You must be six feet away from each other (excluding same household members).
- Masks are required on the pool deck.
- While actively eating or drinking you may remove your face covering but you must be stationary at your chair and maintain six foot distancing.
- BRING YOUR OWN CHAIR. Chair locations have been marked.
- NO SMOKING, NO BATHROMS, NO SHOWERS, NO TABLES, NO ALCOHOL.
- Bring your own sanitizer/wipes to wipe down the pool ladder handles, and gate lock touched after use.
- Limit 14 users in the pool and deck area (this is 50% capacity). If people are waiting to enter the pool area, your time will be limited to one hour.
- AT THIS TIME, the pool and deck will be open Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday, 9 to 11 a.m. and 3 to 5 p.m. The pool and deck are closed all other times.
- There will be a volunteer monitor to enforce these guidelines.
- All posted pool rules still apply.

The Palm Beach County Guidelines require that spot checks be performed while the pool and deck are in use.



# HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE TO DECOMPOSE?\*

Littering is detrimental to our environment. Think before you throw. For instance, cigarette butts, the most littered item in the world, take 10-12 years to decompose. And plastic bags take 1,000 years to decompose. This is why it's so important to recycle and practice proper waste management. See decomposition rate for some common items below:

Paper towels: 2-4 weeks
Banana peel: 3-4 weeks
Paper bag: 1 month
Newspaper: 2 months
Apple core: 2 months
Cardboard: 2 months
Cotton glove: 3 months
Orange peel: 6 months
Plywood: 1-3 years

**Wool sock**: 1-5 years **Milk carton**: 5 years

Cigarette butts: 10-12 years Leather shoe: 25-40 years Tinned steel can: 50 years Rubber boot sole: 50-80 years Plastic container: 50-80 years Aluminum can: 200-500 years Disposable diaper: 550 years
