THINKING ABOUT MULCHING?

Mulching your landscaping can enhance the look and provide many benefits if done properly. It can reduce heat to the plant's roots in summer, keep heat in during the winter, help retain moisture and help reduce weeds. Mulch, as it decomposes will add nutrients to the soil thereby reducing the amount of fertilizer needed.

Your mulch should not be more than 2 to 3 inches deep. Any more than that could block oxygen from reaching the plant roots. Mulching to deep can also keep moisture from reaching the roots. Never put mulch right up against your plants. Leave 2 to 3 inches around the plant again for proper oxygen to the roots. When mulching around trees leave 12 to 18 inches minimum from the base of the tree. NEVER pile mulch against the base of the tree in a mound, (known as 'volcano mulching'). This will cause rotting of the bark around the base which will cause fungus and insect issues eventually killing the tree.

So, what kind of mulch should I use? There are a vast variety of mulches out there. Here are a few you can find locally and some information to help you choose.

PINE BARKK: This is a byproduct of the forest industry making it a sustainable option. It is long lasting and breaks down slowly. It is possible as it breaks down to change the Ph level of the soil in the area it is in.

MELALEUCA: This mulch is produced while also eliminating an invasive species. The mulch is heat treated to kill any seeds so they will not germinate. It is very eco-friendly and has a similar look to Cypress. It is also slow to decompose.

EUCALYPTUS MULCH: This is harvested from Eucalyptus farms and grown just for this purpose making very sustainable and another great eco-friendly option.

UTILITY MULCH: This is a mix of plants and trees mulched during routine pruning. This mulch will more than likely contain a variety of seeds from the pruning. Not really the prettiest and often has large chunks in it.

DYED MULCH: This mulch is dyed a variety of colors like red, black or brown. There has not been a lot of research on the effects of the dyes but even so, it is not the best grade mulch. It is made by mulching old pallets., wood scraps and construction debris. Various chemicals could also be contaminating the wood from the recycled wood being used.

CYPRESS MULCH: This is probably the least friendly to the environment. The harvesting practices are not always the best and often cause damage to the environment. While it may smell good in the beginning it does not last as long as Melaleuca or Eucalyptus. It is also possible it can attract termites.
