

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

We finally had a June board meeting after cancelling March, April, and May meetings due to Covid-19. We met outside at the Forest Oaks Golf Club patio with social distancing and wearing of face masks.

Unfortunately, we were missing a big part of our community and board member, Jean Pasqua. Jean served as Vice-President and was a long-time member (since May of 1986). She passed away June 15th and was interred in Hopewell Junction, NY, where she originally resided.

Items discussed at the June meeting included:

- Canals along residences bordering golf course holes two and nine and the lake at hole eight are being sprayed monthly again.
- Pool repairs are complete but the pool still remains closed due to restrictions set forth from the County.
- We are fixing air conditioning ducts at the Clubhouse because of air leakage into the attic space.

- We are landscaping the island at Pine Needle Lane.
- The electric panel in the Clubhouse is being replaced. The current panel is obsolete and dangerous.
- Per Florida Statute Chapter 712, we preserved our current Covenant and Restriction documents.
- A letter is being sent to homeowners along the wooden fence line on Lucerne Lakes Boulevard reminding the homeowners to clear all shrubbery and trees at least 2-1/2 feet from the fence.

At this time, the pool and clubhouse are still closed due Covid-19 rules. We are monitoring the Palm Beach County news briefs daily and will proceed accordingly.

We decided to have a July board meeting which will take place on July 15, 2020 at 6:30 p.m. at the Forest Oaks Golf Club patio. Please wear face coverings and be prepared to social distance.

FUN FACTS ABOUT THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE



Here are a few fun facts about the Declaration of Independence that might surprise you:

- We didn't actually declare independence on the 4th of July. One of the greatest misconceptions of the 4th of July lies in the name and date. It is widely believed that America declared independence from Britain on July 4, 1776, but the official vote took place two days before and the "Declaration" was published in papers on July 4th.
- Only two men signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. Charles Thompson and the infamous John Hancock were the only two men who actually signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. The other 54 delegates signed over the course of the next month.
- There is something written on the back of the Declaration of Independence. No, it isn't a treasure map in invisible ink. According to sources, a simple message is written upside-down across the bottom of the signed document that reads, "Original Declaration of Independence dated 4th of July 1776".
- 4. The average age of the signers was 45 years. Of the 56 signers, the youngest signers, Thomas Lynch, Jr. and Edward Rutledge of South Carolina, were only 26. However, Benjamin Franklin of Pennsylvania was the oldest signer at 70 years old.
- 5. The Declaration of Independence was written on a laptop! Okay, not a modern laptop, but still, Thomas Jefferson drafted the Declaration of Independence on a writing desk that could fit over one's lap. This device was referred to at the time as a "laptop". GRANDPARENT SCAMS IN THE AGE OF CORONAVIRUS*




Grandma: "I'm in the hospital, sick, please wire money right away". Grandpa: "I'm stuck overseas, please send money." Grandparent scams can take a new urgent twist in these days of Coronavirus. Here's what to keep in mind.

In grandparent scams, scammers pose as panicked grandkids in trouble, calling or sending messages urging you to wire money immediately. They tug at your heartstrings so they can trick you into sending money before you realize it's a scam. So how can we avoid family emergency scams? If someone calls or sends a message claiming to be a family member or friend (or even an organization) desperate for money:

- **Resist the urge to act immediately** no matter how dramatic the story is.
- Verify the caller's identity. Ask questions that a stranger couldn't possibly answer. Call a phone number for your family member/friend that you know to be genuine. Check the story out with another family member, even if you are told to keep it a secret.
- **Don't send cash, gift cards, or money transfers**. Once the scammer gets the money, it's gone.

Palm Beach County Water Utilities Department to Flush Lines with Chlorine Starting July 8, 2020



In order to maintain compliance with regulatory water quality requirements in the water distribution system, the Palm Beach County Water Utilities department (PBCWUD) will temporarily modify its water disinfection process between July 8 and July 29, 2020.

Periodic modifications to the water disinfection process are standard practice and recommended by the Palm Beach County Health Department as a precautionary measure to maintain high water quality in the County's water distribution system.

Customers served by PBCWUD may notice a slight chlorine taste and odor during this period. These conditions are temporary and will not cause any adverse health effects.

Those who are especially sensitive to this taste or odor of chlorine can keep an open container of drinking water in their refrigerator for a few hours to allow the chlorine to dissipate.


Users of home dialysis machines and owners of tropical fish tanks are advised to seek professional advice as the method of removing free chlorine residuals differs from removing chloramine residuals.

<u>Animal</u> <u>Waste</u> <u>Pickup</u>



Did you know, as of 1991, dog waste is considered a nonpoint source pollutant by the Environmental Protection Agency, which puts it in the same category as herbicides and insecticides? Did you know unattended waste can harm your health? Did you know ringworms, roundworm, salmonella and giardia are some of the bacteria found in dog waste? Did you know a roundworm can remain infectious in contaminated soil or water for years?

All pet owners have an important responsibility to keep pet waste off the grounds in our neighborhood. The Palm Beach County Animal Care and Control Ordinance for Animal Waste states the following (Ordinance No. 98-22, Section 4-9):

 The owner of every dog and cat shall be responsible for the removal of any feces deposited by his/her animal on public property, public walks, public beaches, recreation areas or <u>private property of</u> <u>others</u>.

Please remember to clean up after your dog which provides a cleaner, safer place for us all to live. <u>WHEN</u> <u>CLEANING UP AFTER YOUR POOCH, DO NOT DISPOSE</u> <u>OF THEIR POOP IN STORM DRAINS!</u>
